Teaching Input

- Show children the characters on the slides and the problems they are having telling the time. Can you help them work out where they are going wrong? Go through each example as a class and give children time to discuss how they would solve each problem.

- Alternatively, children could stick each of the questions onto a large sheet of paper. They can then annotate each one with the answers, drawing clock faces and other diagrams where appropriate.
